

# **SAT/SMT/AR International School**

## **The School on Satisfiability, Satisfiability Modulo Theories and Automated Reasoning**

Relevant conferences: SAT, SMT, CADE, IJCAR.

Relevant committees: the SAT association, the SMT steering committee, the CADE trustees and the IJCAR steering committee. The last two count as one.

### **— Bylaws —**

1. The aim is to have one School at least every second year, preferably every year. The School should be affiliated to a relevant conference and scheduled to ease the attendance of students to the relevant conferences as well as the school.
2. The SAT/SMT/AR School has a coordination committee of four members, in place for at most five years. Its sole purpose is to synchronize the discussion between the relevant committees. Three members are representative of the relevant committees, one for each. The fourth member is proposed by the coordination committee and ideally approved by consensus by all relevant committees. When a member steps out for any reason, including expiration of the five-year term, the coordination committee decides with the relevant committee on a new member.
3. The SAT/SMT/AR School coordination committee finds one or several organizing chair(s) (OC) for the School one year in advance, when the location and dates for the relevant conferences are fixed. The coordination committee can issue a call for organizing chair and location, if needed.
4. The OC decides on the topics and lecturers of the School in consultation with the coordination committee.
5. The OC is responsible for the local arrangements of the school including publicity and carries the sole financial responsibility.
6. There is no obligation for the OC to refund lecturers for their travel. If funding is problematic for an organizer, lecturers can be selected based on their capability to contribute to the School by funding their own travel expenses.
7. The OC shall investigate if hybrid participation is possible, and if remote participation can be offered for free.
8. Any modification of the bylaws must be proposed for discussion to the coordination committee four weeks before the school. The coordination committee reports on the relevant committees about the initial proposal, its decision to change the bylaws or not, and the changes if any. The relevant committees must approve the changes.
